

Stockton Virtual School

Case Study

Background

Stockton Virtual School is dedicated to enhancing the educational outcomes of children and young people in their care, supporting learners from birth up to the age of 18.

The Headteacher and/or Designated Teacher (DT) at each school collaborates with the virtual school staff, sharing key information that enables the virtual school to closely monitor and track the academic development and well-being of each young person under their care.

After hearing about Cornerstone VR from another local virtual school, Stockton Virtual School were keen to implement Virtual Reality (VR) into their training sessions to help put Attachment, Award and Trauma Informed (AATI) learning into context for their school and social care teams, and to provide professionals with a deeper understanding of children's lived experiences.





The Mission

When considering the use of VR, Stockton Virtual School really wanted to aid professionals in making a connection between what they'd learnt about AATI theory, and how a child's trauma responses are embedded.

The aim was to give adults an opportunity to consider a child's lived experience and reflect not just on the impact of that trauma, but also how it might feel.

Traditional training sessions typically involve a focus on cognitive learning, but sessions using VR also help participants to feel and learn emotionally, which can amplify that learning considerably.

As someone delivering sessions, I have been very impressed by the impact the VR content has. Participants frequently comment that viewing the situations from a child's perspective helps them reconsider the depth of the trauma that children experience, and understand better the enduring legacy it leaves.

The Outcome

During the training, Stockton Virtual Schools delivered training to at least 575 participants, and reached 35 different educational settings.

In addition to the educational settings, they also delivered sessions to foster carers, the police, residential home staff, local authority staff teams, and social workers.

The first schools that participated completed a pre-course survey and a follow up survey several months after the training to see if the VR had an affect. The results from the survey showed that staff saw an increase in their understanding of how trauma (including neglect) can have an impact on a child's wellbeing, and how confident and effective they are at applying the knowledge to real-life interactions with children. All training evaluations conducted rated the VR training as **good** or **excellent**.
